

ZOOM & NET INFORMATION

This is just a reminder that even though we are now currently at level-1 and are able to resume meeting at the clubrooms please don't forget our continuation with meetings on Zoom & the 7125 repeater on Wednesdays.

The Wednesday Afternoon meetings on the 7125 repeater takes place at 1400 UTC 2 pm) with a general chat and different Net Master each week.
